Harlequin Fence McVey and Gillespie, 2020

Our multi-coloured ceramic sculpture symbolises hope, blossoming and regrowth. This stoneware artwork provides a permanent counterpoint to the changing seasonal colours of nature in the park.

The Great Conjunction Weighand Lyle, 2020

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This hand-fabricated brasswork sculpture is an abstract work inspired by the celestial mapping of Jupiter, Saturn, the moon and other heavenly bodies as aligned on the Winter Solstice in 2020.

Ceramic Hearts/ Trumpet Flowers McVey 2018 - 2020

McVey's trademark ceramic hearts are inspired by the history and heritage of Gorgie, speaking of connection between people and place. The colourful trumpet flowers create a playful dialogue within urban locations.

Tonalpohualli / Moon Rabbit Gonzalez Robert, 2021

Inspired by ancient Aztec myths, this concrete and metal work is a representation of the cycles of day and night and life and death. The rabbit is a symbol of abundance and fertility.

Spring: Remnants Weighand Lyle, 2021

These multiple cast concrete forms are inspired by the artist's interest in geological remnants and fossil forms. This work features 5 site-specific pieces which are preserved impressions of place and time.
